NEWBORN FOLLOW UP

After discharge from the hospital you will be given an appointment for a newborn follow up. This appointment is important for you to keep. This appointment evaluates feeding and jaundice issues.

TWO WEEK FOLLOW UP AND WEIGHT CHECKS

After your initial newborn visit, your provider will have you follow up in two weeks. During this nurse run clinic, your infant will have their weight checked to make sure they are gaining the right amount and any other services as ordered by the provider. This is an excellent time for you to ask any questions. Please write your questions down and bring them with you.

12 Months	Your child will have a physical exam and receive
	immunizations. The nurse will draw blood to check for
	lead poisoning and anemia.
15 Months	Your child will have a physical exam and receive
	immunizations.
18 Months	Your child will have a physical exam and receive
	immunizations. Lab work is not usually necessary at
	this visit.

2 Years	Your child will have a physical exam.
3 Years	Your child will have a physical exam.
4 Years	Your child will have a physical exam. He/she will be
	eligible for Kindergarten vaccines.
5-6 Years	IT'S KINDERGARTEN TIME! Your child will have a
	physical exam and all lab work and vaccines that were
	not done at the 4 year old visit will be done at this visit.
	The nurse will also check your child's vision and
	hearing.
<u>6 - 18 Years</u>	We recommend your child have a physical exam every
	1-3 years, depending upon each individual's health
	status.
